Food Insecurity Continues for Haiti



At the top of our list of concerns for the community we serve in Bremen is the lack of food. Last year was the beginning of a Food Insecurity situation with the political instability and the Covid epidemic. The Covid cases have gone down but the political instability and the violent gang activity across the country has escalated. The US Embassy in Port au Prince is keeping the security level at its highest level of 4. This is due to the shootings,

robberies, car jacking and kidnappings that have increased. The major cities are the most affected but no community is immune to the possibility of a gang setting up residence. All of these factors cause the markets to be closed and any source of food to be limited. It is a situation that we predicted would be a major issue in 2021.

Our biggest need to combat this food insecurity are funds to purchase the bulk supplies of rice, beans and cooking oil for distribution to those in our community who are most in need.

50 pound bags of rice are \$40 each 40 pound bags of beans are \$30 each and a 5 gallon container of cooking oil is \$30.

This amount will feed 5 families for a month. The village we serve has 70 families. Our bulk supplies will be used up in mid April. Please consider helping us.

Malnutrition Clinic News



There is good news from the Malnutrition Clinic. Of our 50 initial patients, we have successfully graduated 25 small children and infants who were malnourished. They were able to reach their target weight within

three months of getting our nutrient treatment in the clinic. We thank God and each one of you for your generosity to help us make this possible. For each graduate there is a new patient waiting

to be placed in the clinic. Your help is needed to keep the clinic supplied with the nutrient packs. Each box of 150 nutrient packs will treat 4 patients for one month at a cost of \$70 a box. Thank you for the prayers and help.
